HIGH COURT AT CALCUTTA

OFFICE ORDER NO. 61 OF 2021.

Complaints have been received to the effect that State Emblem of India is unlawfully

being displayed by the Orderlies of the Calcutta High Court on their uniforms at the

place of chest/shirt buttons etc. Further, it is reported that the Official Seal of the

Hon'ble Court having Dharma/Ashok Chakra, imprinted/stamped on the backside of

the Certified Copies of Orders/Directions of the Hon'ble Court, are improper/worn out.

Having taken congnizance of such complaints, the Hon'ble the Chief Justice has been

pleased to pass the following order:

"The Registrar General and Registrar (Original Side) will ensure that all

objectionable marks being maintained in the custody of the Jamadars and other

staff are requisitioned, obtained in custody and reported to me within a period of

one week. Immediate action may be taken in this regard."

The departmental heads on both the Appellate Side and Original Side establishments

are accordingly directed to ensure that all the objectionable marks of State Emblem of

India, unauthorisedly used on the buttons/badges or stitchings as a part of liveries by

the Orderlies/Jamaders/other Group-D employees and/or otherwise used by any

staff, are deposited with the Deputy Registrar (Establlishment), Appellate Side/

Deputy Registrar (Administration), Original Side, as the case may be, within 4(four)

days from the date of issuance hereof. A report to such effect be submitted by the

concerned authorities immediately thereafter.

The custodians of the Official Seals of this Hon'ble Court, are also directed to submit a

report within the period stipulated above as to whether the impression of State

Emblem embossed thereon are clearly precise and distinct, or whether, being worn

out, need immediate replacement.
